Todd Dulin has more than 20 years of baseball coaching experience at the high school level. He has been the head baseball coach at North Andover High School for the last 17 years, and has been the assistant ski coach at the high school since 2019. He also coached football for 14 seasons at both the middle school and high school levels, and was the girls freshman basketball coach for 4 years.

Eight years ago Todd was invited to join the Massachusetts Baseball Coaches Association Executive Board. Each year the MBCA E-Board runs a coaching clinic for the baseball coaches in the state of Massachusetts. Todd has also been a presenter at the annual clinic.

Todd regularly runs instructional clinics for North Andover's little league, and has run clinics for the little league coaches on how to teach the fundamentals of baseball for grades 3-8.

In the past 17 years the North Andover High School Baseball Program has had more than 60 players go on to play college baseball. In 2022 there were a number of former North Andover High School baseball players in the news. The 2019 Massachusetts Gatorade Player of the year Sebastian Keane was drafted in the 2022 MLB Draft by the NY Yankees. Evan Glew from the class of 2015 was named the NJCAA Division III Assistant Coach of the Year. 2016 Graduate, Joe Bramanti was named to the 2022 First Team America East All Conference Team for the UMaine Blackbears. Chris Bosco, 2015 Graduate, was named Dartmouth University's hitting coach.

The North Andover High School Baseball team has won seven straight Merrimack Valley Conference Championships. In 2019 they won the Massachusetts State Championship, and in 2009 and 2011 they won the North Sectional Championship. In 2009 and 2019 Todd Dulin was named the Boston Globe Baseball Coach of the Year, and in 2015 he was named the Boston Herald Baseball Coach of the Year.

Todd is a history teacher at North Andover High School and his wife Karla is a Guidance counselor at an elementary school in North Andover. They live in Atkinson, New Hampshire, just over the border from Massachusetts.
